It was a difficult and trying time for all of our football community. I had the honour of attending this young man's memorial service, and what I saw was overwhelming. I saw people there to support his friends and family from all high school teams across the province, from the referee's association, from Bison football and the Winnipeg Football Club, amongst many others. I even saw some of the officials from the Grey Cup game there to offer support. It was a true embodiment of what the football community can do - come together and be united like no other group.

In summation, 2025 was a great year for football and for Football Manitoba. I sincerely look forward to an even better 2026!



The evaluation process kicks off on January 4th with a Prep Camp that prepares athletes for the skills, drills and assessments of the ID Camps. Athletes will then partake in two ID Camp sessions, on each of January 11th and 18th.

COACHES AND OFFICIALS

>>> NCCP TRAINING



Football Canada is in the process of making changes to NCCP training delivery and stream requirements for all tackle and flag coaches, in conjunction with the Coaching Association of Canada.

As soon as final details of all changes are available, we will update our websites with a schedule of training events for the early 2026, as well as provide information on new "on-line" delivery options for some of the existing NCCP modules.

>>> COACH IDENTIFICATION CARDS

Starting in 2026 Football Manitoba is planning to make changes to our Coach ID Card program. Going forward, qualified coaches will receive one card to use for the entire calendar year for each discipline. Those participating in both tackle and flag disciplines will receive two cards - one for coaching tackle and one for coaching flag.

Coaches will still be required to register for each league or season they are participating in but will no longer require a separate card for each one. Stay tuned for more information!

>>> FLAG OFFICIALS

Another opportunity to become a flag official will be offered early January 2026, prior to the indoor Winter NFL flag season.

Stay involved in football all year round, assist us with our growing football programs, and earn money starting at \$20 per one-hour game! Anyone turning 14 years old in 2026 (or older) is eligible to become a Manitoba flag official.
