



2025 REGISTRATION GUIDE





Welcome

Thank you for your interest in the Manitoba Minor Football Association. 2025 Registration will open in the week of March 22nd and close June 30th.

With support from Old Dutch Foods, The Winnipeg Blue Bombers and Football Manitoba, the MMFA is a developmental co-ed tackle Football League where other than the footwear all equipment is supplied by the clubs.

With 4 Divisions divided into 2 year age increments; we provide players of all sizes, shapes, and skill levels an opportunity to safely learn and play tackle football and meet and make new friends.



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U10 Cruncher

For Players born in 2016 and 2017

An introduction to the game, with an emphasis on fun; U10 Cruncher Football is played 6 on 6 with a coach joining the players on the field to assist in placing the players in the correct spot (offence or defence).

Games are one hour in length (including a brief 10 minute intermission); and fun and equal play are focus of the Cruncher Division.





U12 Atom

For Players born in 2014 and 2015

U12 (Atom Division) takes the players through the next phase of skill development while still providing a safe and fun environment.

This is a competitive division which tracks scores, wins and losses. Players continue to learn the fundamental skills required to progress through the older age groups. Coaches are no longer on the field and there is slight adjustments to field size consistent with the amount of players participating. Play at this age group takes on the familiar form of the game and follows most of the same rules we would be familiar with.



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U14 PeeWee

For Players born in 2012 and 2013



U14 (PeeWee Division) sees the players rapidly advancing their skill development as they are physically more developed. Significantly more detailed plays are used as players develop a better understanding of offensive and defensive systems and strategies. Some players will begin to focus on skill specific positions. Play at this age group takes on the familiar look using more recognizable plays and skills, including special teams. PeeWees utilize the full football field with 12 players on the field per team.

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U16 Bantam

For Players born in 2010 and 2011

U16 (Bantam Division)
focuses on more position specific
development of football specific skills.

This division is more advanced as plays are more complex and the player skill level is noticeably advanced. Games are played on a modified size field with 9 players on the field per team.



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Registration

12 Clubs participate in the MMFA each of which represent a defined geographic (catchment) area.

Clubs invest the money to purchase and maintain player and field equipment; educate and train coaches; and provide and upkeep fields to practice and to play games.

Players have the choice to play at a Club with their neighbourhood friends or to play at a Club with their school friends. This is achieved by choosing either the home or the school address as the primary address when registering.

Clubs form Teams in the respective age divisions based on the registrations received as denoted by the address of their home or school .

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
Registration

Step 1

MMFA registration is done online and starts with first identifying your Club by using the catchment map.

Make sure you write down your assigned Club as you will need to select that later when you register

Step 2



Want to play at a Club with your neighbourhood friends, no problem use your home address to register. Want to play at a Club with your friends from school - no problem use your school address to register.

The catchment map clearly identifies the 12 Zones (or Clubs). Additionally there are 4 areas denoted as shared. In shared areas you can choose from one of the shared Zones (Clubs) to register with. Lastly you will find 2 areas denoted as open. In open areas you can choose any Club with available space to register in.

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Step 3

At checkout, to complete the Online Registration; you may be prompted to chose 1 of 3 Payment Options:

- 1) Pay in Full using MasterCard or Visa
- 2) Pay in up to 3 instalments (at checkout/ on or before June 1st / on or before July 1st.

3) Request Financial Assistance (League & Program Fees only). Financial Assistance is not available for Club Volunteer Bonds or Club Equipment Deposits.

Note: Selecting the Financial Assistance option ***does not confirm*** Registration, it only holds a place for up to 30 Days. If confirmation of financial assistance from the funding agency has not been received within 30 days - the registration may be cancelled
Please note:

this option **is only** for those seeking Financial Assistance.

IMPORTANT: Please note; registering in a zone (Club) that is not where your primary home address is located or not where your school address is located will nullify your registration.

All completed Registrations are time and date stamped upon completion. As spaces on teams are limited, please follow the instructions in this guide for a successful registration.

Now that you have confirmed your correct Zone (Club) that you are registering with and have your preference for payment method selected it's time to begin your actual Online Registration.
